

The Residuals Project is a

collaboration by artists to produce large panels which are suspended from the ceiling allowing a viewer to move underneath them.

Artists dance upon a panel – a performance; the movement creating marks from wells of pigment and media deposited upon it.

An initial architecture is created by the position, quantity and quantity of pigment and media on the panel.

A movement score guides the performance – its movement and the composition of the dance, which is also filmed and photographed.

Thus, a performance – a dance - and a material object – a panel result.

The temporal and structural elements of artistic creation are revealed in the work.
